Who we're looking for

We are looking for new members to join the Growing Support Advisory Group, to share their unique expertise and act as critical friends. Our Advisory groups are highly respected professionals who give their time, both as individuals on site, and working as a group at bi-annual meetings, to advise on strategy and significant projects. The aim is to share our Growing Support plans with a talented community of volunteer advisers, to encourage debate, challenge and critique to enhance our thinking and help us ensure successful delivery. Our plans span membership, fundraising, retail, retail online, food and beverage, holidays and corporate partnerships. We are focused on four areas of development: effortless engagement, building relationships, sustainable growth and diversifying funding. This Advisory Group will support the Trust directorate responsible for creating 92% of the Trust's income and looks after over 6 million supporters. We are looking for people who are active and expert in their roles, who are part of commercial or membership-led organisations, part of a visitor business or engaged in fundraising activities.

Membership of an Advisory Group is for an initial term of three years, with the potential for a second term, pending agreement from staff and the volunteer in question. The Growing Support Advisory Group is expected to meet twice per year, initially at informal all-day meetings to share and discuss our broad plans for the Trust to grow support and deliver revenue. The group will later examine aspects of the

plans in more detail to critique and enhance our thinking.

Further to this, members can be invited to attend property visits to provide advice on specific projects or

support strategic pieces of work.

The positions are voluntary, but expenses are paid. Volunteers will be expected to reflect the Trust's Values & Behaviours at all times, providing insightful, constructive advice in a collaborative and professional manner during meetings and out on site.
